## Interested in hiring a veteran?

Veterans are excellent job candidates. They have the skills, knowledge, and work ethic—as well as leadership and teamwork experience—to be an asset in any workplace. Get started locating qualified veterans for your job openings using the tools and resources on [www.CareerOneStop.org/HireAVet](http://www.CareerOneStop.org/HireAVet).

### Post your job openings on your state job bank.

It's always free to post jobs on your state job bank and it can also be a great way to connect with job-seeking veterans.

- Many veterans search for jobs via state job banks, and some states even offer veterans priority access to job postings.

### Contact your local American Job Center.

Visit [www.CareerOneStop.org/FindJobCenters](http://www.CareerOneStop.org/FindJobCenters) to locate your closest American Job Center (AJC).

- Ask to speak to a Veterans Employment Representative, Business Service Representative, or other AJC staff.
- Let the AJC staff know you want to hire a veteran. They may ask for details of your job listing(s), and they'll help you identify qualified veterans that match your needs.

### Identify military qualifications.

- Enter the title of your job opening.
- Find military occupations that relate to experiences needed for your job opening.

- You may qualify if you hire a veteran who has a service-connected disability, is unemployed, or is receiving SNAP (food stamp) benefits.
